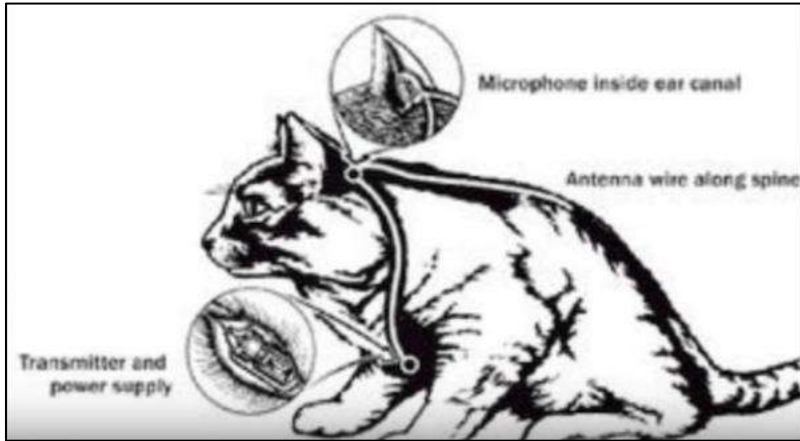
Once finished, the teachers correct it and we work together on the mistakes. It's very challenging and interesting and you can learn new things while looking for ideas for the articles.

Interview with the scientist Claudio Bortolin



"I am passionate about the idea of being part of a journey started in the mists of time: the adventure of knowledge".

These are the words of Claudio Bortolin, a brilliant scientist and researcher at CERN in Geneva. His career as a particle physicist began as a "joke of fate". He tells us this in the interview he gave to the class 2°H in November, on the inauguration of the project **"SPAZIOALLO SPAZIO"**.

In this first issue of the newspaper we publish the first 6 questions of which only the last 2 were made in English (we decided not to translate those in Italian to not compromise the originality of the answers).

For the second part of the interview we are waiting for you at the next issue.

1. Che cosa l'ha spinto a scegliere un lavoro così particolare?

Mi piace descriverlo come uno scherzo del destino, ma andiamo con ordine. Dovete sapere che ho iniziato l'Università a 28 anni, a dirla tutta... mi hanno iscritto senza nemmeno dirmelo. Pertanto mi sono trovato nel 2002 a dover riprendere la vita dello studente, mentre insegnavo materie di laboratorio negli istituti tecnici e professionali.

Dopo mille peripezie e mille mila weekend trascorsi sui libri, ho finito la

triennale nel 2005 e iniziato l'ultima parte del percorso: la laurea specialistica in ingegneria meccanica all'Università di Udine.

All'epoca riuscii a trovare un posto come insegnante all'istituto tecnico serale e così riuscivo a districarmi meglio tra le lezioni all'università e le lezioni a scuola. Ecco, le regole accademiche mi permettevano in quei due anni di sostituire tre esami di ingegneria con materie diverse.

Ho sempre voluto avventurarmi nel mondo dell'astrofisica e così scelsi "Astrofisica delle particelle"; per poterla frequentare dovevo aver superato "Interazioni fondamentali" che a sua volta avrei potuto seguire se avessi superato Fisica Moderna (Relatività per capirci). Bene, presi il pacchetto di tre e mi ci volle una settimana buona a convincere il responsabile dei piani di studio abituato a quanto pare a ricevere solo richieste di esami da 30 sicuro. Bè, durante il corso di interazioni fondamentali la docente organizzò un viaggio al CERN. Partecipai e quando arrivai al cancello di ingresso e vidi Route Einstein, i laboratori, le aule conferenza, le caverne sperimentali e i sorrisi delle persone che lavoravano lì, ne rimasi totalmente folgorato. Fu amore a prima vista, quel giorno io mi dissi: "Questo è il mio posto, questa è casa, io voglio lavorare qui".

Ad Ottobre 2007 mi sono laureato, a novembre ho vinto un posto per il dottorato di ricerca e a marzo 2008 cominciai il mio dottorato al CERN, dovevo rimanerci 6 mesi o 1 anno. Ne sono trascorsi oltre 13, per ora quella con il CERN è la relazione sentimentale più duratura della mia esistenza.

2. Cosa la appassiona di più del suo lavoro?

Mi appassiona l'idea di far parte di un cammino iniziato nella notte dei tempi: l'avventura della conoscenza. Ci sono stati nei secoli scorsi dei geni assoluti che ci hanno fatto fare passi da gigante nella conoscenza di ciò che ci circonda, per esempio i grandissimi scienziati che avete la fortuna di studiare a scuola.

L'era moderna è frutto di sforzi enormi anche solo per aggiungere qualche tassello a quel puzzle bellissimo che stiamo costruendo fin dall'antichità. In tutta la nostra esistenza siamo arrivati a comprendere

poco più del 4% dell'Universo. Da qualche anno sappiamo che esistono le onde gravitazionali teorizzate cento anni fa, sappiamo che esiste il Bosone di Higgs descritto per la prima volta quasi 50 anni prima. Le menti viaggiano molto più veloci degli esperimenti ma, come dicevo prima, ci rimane comunque da scoprire di cosa è fatto il 96% dell'Universo!!! Siamo nel mezzo di una caccia al tesoro, e ognuno di noi può studiare un indizio, provare ad aggiungere un tassello. **A voi non piacciono le sfide?** A me sì e questo mi appassiona dal profondo del cuore.

3. Che percorso di studi ha fatto? Ha lavorato in altri centri di ricerca?

Mi sono diplomato (non con poca fatica) come perito meccanico presso l'ITIS di Motta di Livenza (TV), l'università come ho già raccontato è arrivata dopo, pensavo di non essere tagliato per fare ingegneria...vabbè si commettono degli errori a volte, ma il bello è che la vita a volte ti dà l'opportunità di rimediare e di recuperare un po' di terreno.

Dopo l'università mi avventurai in un dottorato in ingegneria che svolsi interamente al CERN di Ginevra, con l'esperimento ALICE. Per ora non ho lavorato in altri centri di ricerca.

4. Ci può raccontare un'esperienza lavorativa particolarmente entusiasmante?

Ne ho diverse, ma mi piacerebbe raccontarvele di persona quindi alcune me le tengo così mi invitate di nuovo a scuola ok? Comunque una volta, per risolvere un problema di calibrazione di alcuni sensori di temperatura del rivelatore centrale di ATLAS, abbiamo dovuto inventarci un modo per far giungere in poco tempo un fluido a - 40 gradi centigradi nel centro dell'esperimento e, considerando le difficoltà di movimento tra gallerie, scale e arrampicate per arrivare a destinazione, non è stato facile.

Abbiamo messo un thermos speciale dentro uno zaino, il liquido non potevamo raffreddarlo molto al di sotto dei - 40°C e così abbiamo letteralmente corso per arrivare in tempo; una volta lì dovevamo collegare dei sensori ad una centralina in modo da poter leggere da remoto le temperature dei sensori del rivelatore e confrontarle con quelle del thermos e fare così la calibrazione.

La preparazione di questa cosa ha richiesto un sacco di tempo e non era

ovvio riuscirci. Se la trovo vi allego la foto che ci siamo fatti con il collega una volta giunti a destinazione :)

5. What do you think about the Italian school system? Which differences have you seen with the schools of other countries?

I think the Italian schools are at the top level of the western countries. Italian students are very appreciated when they arrive at CERN, Italian students are very competitive in many technical subjects and our school's curriculum covers a wide range of subjects. This allows Italian students to easily adapt to a variety of situations that you may need to deal with when you are abroad. Knowing some of your teachers, I can tell you are very lucky. Some of the opportunities I had in my life were made available thanks to the initiative of the right teacher in the right moment, so keep your eyes open and your hearts ready.

6. What kind of school did you attend? Which course of study would you suggest for students who want to follow your profession?

I remember that at your age I wanted to be a veterinarian and the most suitable school was the Istituto agrario. In my family there was no farm where I could work and it seemed a risky choice if, at the end of the high school, I did not want to continue to University.

I must admit that at the time I had ideas that were far from being clear, I didn't really know if the vet was the desire of the moment and nothing more. One thing I also liked was the technical subjects, especially mechanics and I thought that an ITIS would allow me to decide whether to work or continue studying with a lower risk.

In the end, **if you follow your heart, you can go through a thousand difficulties, but you will never regret, so follow your wishes** and, if you want to be an astronaut, your way could be the Liceo Scientifico or the Istituto Tecnico, if you love art and you want to follow this career do not hesitate to consider art institutes.

Feminicide



We often hear about feminicide. Too often. 87,000 women are killed every year on average in the world, for gender reasons. And in Italy about 150. By husbands, by boyfriends, by ex-boyfriends, but also by sons and fathers, these women are killed every year.

The definition of a feminicide given by Treccani is:

“Direct or provoked killing, physical elimination or moral annihilation of women and their social role”

But what makes men commit feminicide?

Men who commit feminicide often grew up in violent places, or perhaps they were taught that men are more powerful than women. **But that's not an excuse!**

We think that, especially if you grew up with a violent parent, or in any case in violent environments, you know better than others what it's like to be raped or to see others being raped. In fact, not all grown-up bullies are bad people, but that's one of the main causes.

This year for the World Day of Violence against Women on 25th November, Minister Bonetti gave a speech in Parliament. There were only eight Members present. This shows how everyone says that you have to change and act, but then it seems to be little real interest.

Last year, however, again on this occasion, the actress Paola Cortellesi gave a speech to make us reflect on how some words have very different meanings between male and female.

"It is impressive to see how in our language some terms that have their legitimate meaning to the masculine, if declined to the feminine, suddenly take on another sense, change radically, become a cliché, a somewhat equivocal cliché that then to look well is always the same, or a slight wink towards prostitution. Let me give you some examples.

A courtier: a man who lives at court; a courtesan: a whore.

A masseur: a cinesiterapista; a masseuse: a whore.

A street man: a man of the people; a street woman: a whore.

A man available: a kind and caring man; a woman available: a whore.

A cheerful man: a good-tempered; a cheerful woman: a whore.

A dead cat: a dead cat; a dead cat, a whore.

I do not want to be a woman who complains and recriminates, but even in the lexicon we women who are discriminated against are.

Luckily they are just words and it is a relief to know that all this has never happened so far with us."

Do you know what the story of the pen is?



The pen is an instrument that we use constantly every day of our life.

The first 'pen' in the history was discovered and invented in Egypt. The historians think that it was first invented in 3000 a.C.: it was made of reed and the ink was a gummy black substance.

In the 7th century the reed pens were changed in quill, often made by a goose feather.

To make it, the feather went through a heat-treatment. It was hard to learn how to use it, but, with practice, it became simple.

I don't think I have enough patient to learn how to write with the quill, what about you?

In that time a little part of the population, a VERY little part, like rich people, could read and write. The quill remained popular until the 19th century.

Finally, in the 19's, it was introduced the dip, or nib, pen. It was usually made of wood, it hadn't an ink reservoir, that was used in fountain pens, and they had to be repeatedly dipped in inkpots.

It wasn't convenient, indeed it was so uncomfortable, but there were advantages. The pen could be filled with waterproof ink that corrodes the inside of the fountain ink. Your parents maybe used the dip pen at school: they brought their own inkpots from home and used them.

After the dip pen, we have the fountain pen, used nowadays too. Unlike the nib pen, the fountain has reservoir that can be refilled, called ink cartridge.

The fountain pen is now replaced with the ballpoint pen, invented by László Bíró, an Hungarian newspaper editor, that was annoyed of the fountain pen and decided to make a NEW one!

With his brother George, a chemist, he developed a new mechanism: a little ball is captive in the tip and when the ball rotates, it transfers ink to the paper. Ballpoints pens' ink is long lasting, and this makes those pens favorable and, also, they are cheap.

The ballpoint pen is the most common tool for everyday writing.

Did you know that this simple object has a long and fascinating history?

Valentino Rossi is an Italian former professional motorcycle road racer. He was born on 16th February 1979. Nicknamed The Doctor, he has won premier class World Championships with both Yamaha and Honda.

Initially, Coca Cola was made with the purpose of headache and tiredness relief. In the past, it even had a different name! It was called **“Pemberton’s French Wine Coca”**.

Pemberton’s Coca Cola was a mixture of wine and Coke leaves, eventually other ingredients were added in the recipe. Pemberton advertised his syrup, that became phenomenally successful. Then, this refreshing drink was exported all over the world and after that, in 1892, the Coca Cola Company was founded in America.

In 1903, the cocaine ingredient was removed from the Coca Cola formula.



But how did Pemberton came up with the name “Coca Cola”?

In 1886 Pemberton nailed the formula, but actually it was his bookkeeper who came up with the name. Frank M. Robinson suggested that “the two Cs would look well in advertising” and with that, he also designed the now world famous Coca Cola logo.

And did you know that the two colours used for the logo had a meaning too?

The red colour means strength, passion, love and energy. The white colour means purity, youth and nobility. But what about the bottle shape?

The Coca Cola Co. introduced a diamond shaped label with a colourful trademark, but the labels would come off when stored in ice-cold water. Because of that, it then proposed the bottling community to develop a “bottle so distinct you would recognize it by feeling in the dark or lying broken on the ground”.



The Coca Cola Co. has been advertising for 127 years! The company made a lot of advertisements through the years and many slogans were created.

There are so many of them but we'll name only a few: *Drink Coca Cola*, *Delicious and refreshing*, *Sign of good taste* and so on.

The new 2021 Coca Cola slogan is: *Real Magic*.

Gaelic FOOTBALL



We would like to talk about this sport because it is little known in the world.

The aim of the game is to pass the ball through a goal reminiscent of rugby, with two goalposts and a crossbar separating them, but not at their maximum height: when the ball enters between the poles and under the crossbar, the goal forfeit three points.

When the ball passes over the crossbar and between the two goalposts, only one point is scored.



Gaelic football is played with a round leather ball, similar to football but heavier, made of horizontal zones rather than pentagons and hexagons.

It looks like a volleyball ball.



A Gaelic football pitch is very similar to a rugby pitch, but it is larger.

It is rectangular and characterized by dimension ranging from 130-145 meters in length and 80-90 meters in width 30.



History of Gaelic Football

Between the **60's** and **70's** of the **1800**, rugby began to spread very quickly in Ireland. The first stronghold of the new sport was Trinity College and the consequent regulation of the game by the football Association in **1863** allowed an ever more rapid and immediate diffusion. After some years, according to the **Gaelic football** historian **Jack Mahon**, the sport begun to lose its bite in the Irish countryside.

To worsen the conditions of **Gaelic football** there was the spreading on the island of rugby that found great success especially in **Ulster**, starting from the **1880's**.

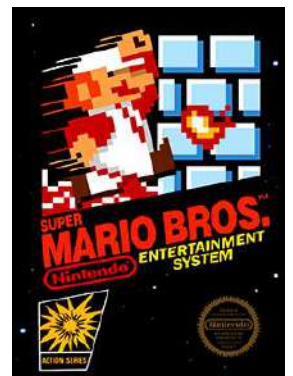
In 1985 Shigeru invented Super Mario Bros where Luigi, Peach Toad and Bowser first appeared.

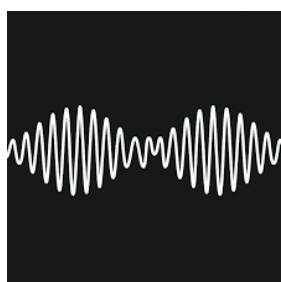
Nowadays this genre is very popular among teens, thanks to the artists and songs that are trending on socials.

ORIENTEERING

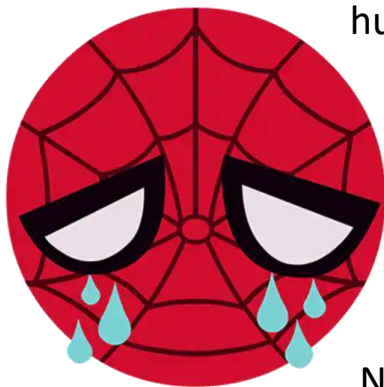


himself and reveals to the world that Peter is ... Spider-Man!!!

Homemade nougat



Nougat is a typical Italian Christmas cake (but it is also made abroad). It is made with toasted almonds or roasted pistachios, held together by a mixture of honey, sugar and eggs.

INGREDIENTS

- 200 g pistachios
- 100 g Sugar
- 100 g Honey
- 1 egg white
- 1 tablespoon Water
- 1 tip of a teaspoon Orange flower water
- Ostia (optional)

PREPARATION

- ❶ If you bought unroasted pistachios, toast them by placing them on a well-spaced baking sheet with parchment paper and bake in a preheated oven at 180 ° for about 10 minutes.
- ❷ Remove the pistachios from the pan and let them cool.
Proceed to prepare the homemade nougat.
- ❸ Put the honey in a bowl, then put the bowl to cook in a bain-marie for about 1 hour, stirring constantly.
- ❹ Put the sugar and a tablespoon of water in a saucepan and let it melt over very low heat for a few minutes, then turn off.
- ❺ Add the sugar syrup and the orange blossom water with honey and mix.
Beat the egg whites until stiff with an electric mixer.
- ❻ Add the whipped egg whites to the honey, stirring gently with a spatula from bottom to top and continue to cook in a bain-marie for about another five minutes.
- ❼ Add whole or chopped pistachios and mix with a spatula.
- ❽ Pour the homemade nougat mixture into an oiled silicone mold or into a baking tray with greaseproof paper and level the surface.
If you want to put the host, place it on the base of a mold, then pour the mixture for the homemade nougat and cover with the second sheet by pressing lightly.
- ❾ Allow the homemade nougat to cool completely before cutting it with a very sharp knife.
